



Guidance Document for 2016-2017 Ohio Pre-ID Files

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About This Document

This guidance document provides key details to assist districts as they prepare their Pre-ID files.

Please make sure your district's data manager or your Information Technology Center has the necessary information and layouts to prepare Pre-ID file uploads for the upcoming school year.

District test coordinators should continue to watch for additional department communications on updates to testing policies and procedures for the 2016-2017 school year.

Pre-ID Layout for OGT

For the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT), districts will continue to use the record layout description for student pre-identification [file format](#) that has been in place for the past several years to Pre-ID students.

Districts will continue to use the paper/pencil TIDE, which is available at www.ohtide.org, to Pre-ID students who are taking the OGT.

New Pre-ID Layout for Ohio's State Tests in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies, the Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment

For 2016-2017, districts must use the [new Pre-ID layout](#) to prepare and submit their student information. The new layout collects student information for English language arts, mathematics, science and social studies tests, the Alternate Assessment for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities (AASCD) and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment (OELPA). The 2016-2017 layout builds on the layout that districts used for submitting their 2015-2016 Pre-ID data.

Districts will use TIDE, which is available at <http://oh.tide.airast.org>, to pre-identify students who are taking Ohio's State Tests, the Alternate Assessment or the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment. TIDE will only accept the 2016-2017 Pre-ID layout. Districts will not be able to use Ohio's prior layouts for 2016-2017 tests.

Notable Updates for 2016-2017

1. TIDE will collect all 2016-2017 student information under the “Ohio State Tests” administration. Some things to note:

- Districts will submit their Pre-ID data for English language arts, mathematics, science and social studies tests, the Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment under the “Ohio State Tests 2016-2017” administration.
- The test eligibility listed in the student’s Pre-ID record applies to all test windows (fall, spring, summer) in the school year.
- It is not necessary to upload new Pre-ID data prior to each administration unless data has changed (e.g., a student has moved to a new school).

2. Rules for uploading subsequent Pre-ID files and overwriting records:

- New Pre-ID file uploads for Ohio’s State Tests, the Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment will not overwrite previous Pre-ID file uploads in [TIDE](#). TIDE checks each record in the new file to determine what updates to make.
- If the SSID is new, TIDE appends the new record to the student listing.
- If the SSID is already present in the student listing, TIDE will update required fields (e.g., demographics such as student name and date of birth). TIDE will only update optional fields when a non-blank value is present in the new file. It is important to note that the test eligibility and mode fields are now “required when applicable,” which follows the same rule.
 - This means, for example, a district may upload one Pre-ID file that includes students’ English language arts test eligibility and mode information. Then, a subsequent file can include students’ math test eligibility and mode information. If the ELA test eligibility and mode fields are left blank in the subsequent file, the students’ existing ELA information will be retained in TIDE and the math information will be appended.
- Any records with SSIDs that were included as part of a prior upload but are not included on a subsequent Pre-ID file upload will remain in TIDE (unless an authorized user deletes them).

3. There is a new process for Pre-ID labels and generic labels:

- For students testing on paper, all scorable documents must have a Pre-ID label applied. **Failure to apply a Pre-ID label will result in scores not being reported.**
- Pre-ID labels for the grades 3 – 8 tests must not be applied to high school scorable documents (and vice-versa). The most common scenario for this is a grade 8 student taking Algebra—do not apply a grade 8 mathematics Pre-ID label to the document; instead, apply an Algebra label to the document. **Failure to apply the correct test administration Pre-ID label will result in scores not being reported on-time.**
- There are now two types of Pre-ID labels: pre-printed Pre-ID labels and print-on-demand Pre-ID labels. The information on both types of labels is the same, and both are placed on the same space on the scorable document.
 - [Pre-printed Pre-ID labels for Ohio’s State Tests](#) are shipped only for students who were successfully entered in TIDE with a paper (P) test mode by the published deadline. **Please note that Ohio’s State Test Pre-ID labels are only shipped for entities that also place on-time orders for the Ohio’s State Tests.**
 - [Pre-printed Pre-ID labels for the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment](#) are shipped for all kindergarten and grade 1 students who were successfully entered in TIDE with an online (O) test mode for the writing supplement by the OELPA deadline.

- When a pre-printed Pre-ID label is not available to apply to a scorable document, a [print-on-demand Pre-ID label](#) should be used. Authorized users can create PDFs of print-on-demand Pre-ID labels in [TIDE](#) and print these on blank label stock. Blank label stock is automatically provided with on-time orders. If the district did not place an on-time order or additional blank label stock is needed, district test coordinators can order it in the additional order window.
- **Generic labels will no longer be provided.** Districts must apply a Pre-ID label.
- If a Pre-ID label is misapplied, do not attempt to remove the label. Place a print-on demand label over the incorrect Pre-ID label, ensuring that the barcode from the incorrect label is completely covered.
- Specific guidance for Pre-ID labels can be found in the Supplemental Instructions for Paper Testing manual, available on the [portal](#).

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I use the same Pre-ID layout for all state tests?

No. [TIDE for OGT](#) is configured separately and requires the “old” Pre-ID layout. TIDE for Ohio’s State Tests, AASCD and OELPA uses the 2016-2017 layout, and will only accept Pre-ID files that follow the 2016-2017 layout.

2. Which file formats are accepted?

[TIDE for OGT](#) accepts TXT files only.

[TIDE](#) accepts TXT, Excel or CSV format. Templates are available for the Excel and CSV formats under the Upload Pre-ID File page in the Student Information task. These templates are also available on the portal under [TIDE Support Documents](#).

3. What is the difference between enrolled grade 13 and enrolled grade 14?

Grade level 13 indicates “adult ed” and is for students enrolled in adult education classes with the district. Grade level 14 indicates “proficiency only” and is for students returning to the district to test who are not enrolled in classes.

4. How is student test eligibility for testing marked?

OGT: When logging into [TIDE for OGT](#), district test coordinators are required to select a test administration. Districts will continue to upload Pre-ID files for OGT under separate administrations (e.g., OGT Fall 2016, OGT Spring 2017). By uploading a file under an OGT administration, the district is indicating that the students listed in the file are eligible for the OGT test(s).

Ohio’s State Tests, the Alternate Assessment, and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment: Districts must expressly mark student test eligibility in the Pre-ID file for Ohio’s State Tests, the Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment. 
5. Does my district have to submit separate Pre-ID files for Ohio’s State Test, the Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment?

No. The 2016-2017 Pre-ID layout includes test eligibility fields that allow districts to identify the test(s) for which students are eligible. Therefore, districts can include students who are eligible for Ohio’s State Tests, the Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment in the same Pre-ID file.

6. Where in TIDE do I submit Pre-ID data?

When logging into [TIDE](#), district test coordinators will select the “Ohio State Tests 2016-2017” administration. Under “Preparing for Testing,” locate the Student Information dropdown. Click the dropdown arrow, then select “Upload Pre-ID File.”

Because the Pre-ID layout collects information on a student’s specific test eligibility and test mode, it is not necessary for districts to upload multiple files under multiple administrations. If they elect, districts can upload one file for all their students, but this is not a requirement. The TIDE system syncs with the Student Testing Site (for Ohio’s State Tests and the OELPA) and the Data Entry Interface (for the Alternate Assessment and OELPA) to set student test eligibility based on Pre-ID data.



7. Does my district have to submit a new Pre-ID file for each administration (fall, spring) of Ohio’s State Tests?

The test eligibility listed in a student’s Pre-ID record will apply to the entire school year, e.g., if a student is pre-identified as eligible for the grade 3 English language arts test, that eligibility applies to the fall 2016 administration and the spring 2017 administration. If a district pre-identifies a student in advance of the fall 2016 administration, the district does not need to pre-identify the student in advance of the spring 2017 administration. However, districts are responsible for ensuring that student records are up-to-date and accurate prior to each administration.

8. Does my district have to submit separate Pre-ID files for each part of the test?

No. If a student is eligible for an Ohio State Test and his/her eligibility is marked in the Pre-ID file, that eligibility applies to part 1 and part 2 of the test. Similarly, if a student is eligible for the OELPA and his/her eligibility is marked in the pre-ID record, that eligibility applies to all domains.

9. Does my district have to Pre-ID all students who are taking Ohio’s State Tests, the Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment?

Yes. Districts must pre-identify all students who are taking an Ohio State Test, Alternate Assessment and the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment in [TIDE](#).

In order for students to access tests in the online Student Testing Site, the student’s Pre-ID record must be listed in TIDE with the appropriate test eligibility. In order for test administrators to access a student’s record in the online Data Entry Interface and enter scores for that student, the student’s Pre-ID record must be listed in TIDE with the appropriate test eligibility.

Districts must pre-identify all students who are taking paper/pencil tests in TIDE by the published deadlines to ensure receipt of Pre-ID labels. Districts that fail to Pre-ID their students who are testing on paper by the deadline must pre-identify their students to create on-demand Pre-ID labels by the end of the test window.

10. What happens if my district misses the deadline for submitting Pre-ID data for Ohio's State Tests, the Alternate Assessment or the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment?

Visit the [Important Dates page](#) of the portal for deadlines for Ohio's State Tests. Districts that fail to submit Pre-ID data for students who will take Ohio State Tests using paper test booklets by the published deadline will not receive pre-printed Pre-ID labels. Please note that pre-printed Pre-ID labels for the Ohio's State Tests are only shipped for entities that also place on-time orders for the Ohio's State Tests. Districts that fail to indicate kindergarten and grade 1 students as Online (O) for the writing supplement by the OELPA Pre-ID deadline, will not receive OELPA pre-printed Pre-ID labels. Districts that do not receive pre-printed Pre-ID labels must pre-identify their students in TIDE and generate on-demand Pre-ID labels by the end of the test window. Blank label stock for on-demand Pre-ID labels can be ordered during the additional order window.

In order for students to take Ohio State Tests or the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment online, districts must Pre-ID them; students cannot test online unless they are pre-identified.

Districts that fail to submit Alternate Assessment Pre-ID data by the [published deadline](#) will not receive second rater assignments in advance of the test window. Students must be pre-identified before scores can be entered in the Data Entry Interface.

11. Will Pre-ID files determine order quantities for paper test materials?

- For Ohio's State Tests, districts with students who are testing on paper must request quantities of paper test materials separately from their Pre-ID data submissions. District test coordinators and/or district administrators must enter quantities for test booklets, answer documents and special versions under the appropriate Paper Orders administration in TIDE. Visit the [Important Dates page](#) of the portal for Ohio's State Tests order windows.
- For the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment, paper tests are intended as an accommodation for students or districts unable to test online. Districts providing the paper accommodation must request quantities of paper test materials in the Paper Orders OELPA Spring 2017 administration in TIDE. Pre-ID information is used to create material orders for the kindergarten and grade 1 writing supplement for online testers. All kindergarten and grade 1 students marked as O (for online) in the Pre-ID file for OELPA, by the OELPA Pre-ID deadline, will receive the paper writing supplements and Pre-ID labels with the initial order delivery.
- For the Alternate Assessment, Test Administration (TA) kits are not shipped based on pre-ID data submission in TIDE. District test coordinators and/or district administrators must enter quantities for TA Kits under the AASCD Spring 2017 TA Kit Orders administration in TIDE. Visit the Alternate Assessment [portal](#) for important dates.

12. Will districts be able to submit online accessibility features and accommodations in the Pre-ID file?

The 2016-2017 Pre-ID layout includes an accommodations field by subject for districts to indicate whether a student is eligible to receive accommodations in that subject. Note that the accommodations fields can be set to “yes” only for students who are marked as having an IEP or 504 or who are marked as ELL/LEP in their Pre-ID record.

Marking whether the student is eligible for accommodations in the Pre-ID layout will not turn on features in the Student Testing Site. Districts can use the Student Test Settings file to turn on/off student test settings and accommodations. This file is optional.

13. If I set the “Limited English Proficient (LEP)” field to “yes”, does that make my student eligible for the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment in the online Student Testing Site?

No. The “Limited English Proficient (LEP)” field, position 237 in the Pre-ID layout, is for district reporting. Districts must use the “Test eligibility & mode: OELPA” field, position 236 in the Pre-ID layout, to indicate student eligibility. Identifying Test Eligibility in Pre-ID Files for Ohio’s State Tests, the Alternate Assessment and Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment
